Uniforms and Supplies for 2022-23

The school uniform for 2022-23 will be the same as this year. Uniform requirements are listed in the School Handbook, which is available at [LumenChristiSchool.org](#). Free used uniform clothing is available in the office – stop by anytime to take a look or to drop off uniform clothes you’re no longer using.

Just a reminder that the book fee that is charged with tuition (\$200 for kindergarten and \$350 for grades 1-12) covers all school supplies, so there is no need for parents to buy school supplies this summer.

Last Week of School Ahead

Elementary School: Next Monday through Wednesday will be full, regular school days.

Thursday will be a half-day, and students can expect a combination of schoolwork and year-end tasks. We will dismiss at noon; students should bring lunch as usual but there will be no milk available; and there will be no aftercare. **K-8 students should return by 5:10 for the End of Year Program.** Please plan for traffic and get students back on time.

Friday we will finish cleaning and host a field day in the park. Students should bring lunch; we will dismiss at noon, and there will be no aftercare.

Students may dress casually for the games on Friday, but because we will be attending Mass that morning, they should dress accordingly – no sweats or baggy athletic attire. Students should wear modest T-shirts, pants should not be ripped, and shorts should be no more than 4 inches above the knee.

High School: Monday is a Reading Day – no classes. Exams will be held Tuesday through Thursday, and Friday will be a half-day for students to clean up and prepare the buildings for renovation.
