GOOD GRIEF

Yesterday, Memorial Day, I travelled to Saint John's Cemetery in Fort Mitchell, KY to visit family graves. I visited the grave of my brother Mick, who died on Thanksgiving 2016. Yesterday was the first time that I saw his newly-placed gravestone. I saw it and I burst into tears. I thought I had finished with my intense grieving over Mick's death. Obviously not.

Grief is most often a sign of love, and love endures all things. But that also means that it lasts. It often diminishes, but seldom totally leaves. And that's a good thing.

Grief does not necessarily indicate a lack of faith. Jesus wept at the grave of his friend Lazarus.

We are all one body in Christ. Let's be gentle and understanding with ourselves and each other in our grief, whether it is at the time of a funeral of a loved one, or years after.

Let's not be shy about attending the funerals of parishioners, even those we may not have known, or didn't know well. And let's continue our tradition of serving a meal, prepared by parishioners, to the grieving family after the funeral Mass. Our Director of Music Ministries, Brian Hunt, would be thrilled to add more members to the faithful parishioners who make up our small choir for funeral Masses.

And let's remember that grief lasts. I have a friend who sends me a note every year on the anniversary of my father's death, even though it was in 1999. I cherish those annual messages. Checking up on those who have lost a loved one is never intrusive and always appropriate.

The saying on my brother's gravestone is: "Love One Another". Tending to the grieving is a powerful way to do this.

June 2018 Financial News Notes:

- Last month I announced my decision to retire as Business Manager effective August 31, 2018 - I assumed the Business Manager's job at Mary Queen in September 2000, succeeding Jim Paris, who was the first person to assume this position as an employee. Wayne Rickert was active for many years before that as a volunteer. This experience to serve Mary Queen for 18 years has been most fulfilling because of the love I have for the people of the parish and the numerous gifts received daily from the Holy Spirit. It has been a pleasure to work with so many wonderful people, but especially Fr. Dan Noll. With my retirement, it will allow Fr. Dan the opportunity to restructure the organizational chart to make the parish more attentive to the needs of the parish in the areas of Finance, Facilities, Office Management, and Communication. The parish will be much better served after the implementation of these changes. Thanks for all you do and God bless you!!
- With the changes in organizational structure, Mary Queen will hire a Business Manager and a Facilities Manager. The job postings are included in the following medias: Diocesan website under "employment" <http://www.cdlex.org/at-will-employment-non-school-opportunities>, bulletin stuffer, and the MQ parish and school websites.
- The new Facilities Manager will oversee the projects affecting the facility improvements from the \$400k as noted in the following bullet...
- The Mary Queen Finance Council has implemented a Cash Liquidity Management policy effective 1/9/18. With this policy, we are to manage a cash liquidity of 45-60 days. Any liquid cash in excess of 60 days may be used for appropriate parish use as directed by the Pastor. Father Dan consulted with the Parish Pastoral Council on March 27th, along with the Committees represented on the Council, the Hispanic Leadership Group (Comite), and the Parish Staff. He has decided on a plan to best use the \$400,000 available to further the Mission of Mary Queen of the Holy Rosary Parish. These projects are as follows: 1. Church renovation of pews, kneelers, carpet, 2. Lift, 3. Dishwashers at school and church, 4. new parking lot at parish office, 5. Advocacy for those facing deportation, 6. shelter by playground, 7. marketing study/training, 8. Cornelia Nash Fund, 9. GEO partnership, 10. MQ school counseling enrichment, 11. contingency.
- The 5th annual spring fundraiser entitled "Night of Angels" was held on Friday April 20th at The Round Barn Stable of Memories at Red Mile. There was food and refreshments, silent and live auctions and a raffle. Everyone enjoyed the evening. Last year the event made over \$52,000 for our school operating budget. The budget is \$45,000. The net results thus far are about \$39,000.
- Mark your calendars . . . Festival 2018 . . . The date will be October 12-13. Any and all volunteers are welcome. We need you . . . contact Melissa Sloan.
- The Diocesan Annual Appeal weekend has been changed from the spring to the fall - October 2018. Stay tuned for more information.
- The debt on the school is \$4,714,933 for the tax exempt loan. This loan is with Kentucky Bank.
- Other things happening in the parish office....Parish Data System review task force, Bus/van task force, Security is under review, Safety inspections, Stewardship Safe Environment review and updates, time and talent sign up names to leadership, a communications/marketing project, and an office organization review.

Bible Study We are finishing up a wonderful 6 week study on Prayer through the Formed Program. We are learning about Lectio Divina, a step by step progression of dialoguing with God: learning how to listen and dialogue and contemplate God's message to us.

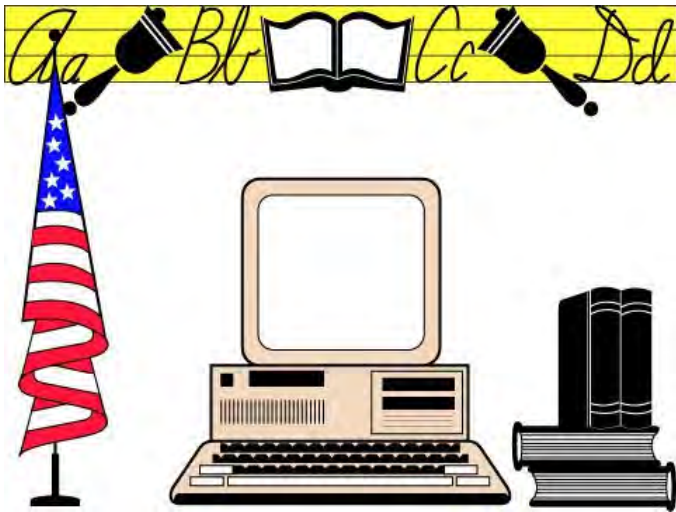

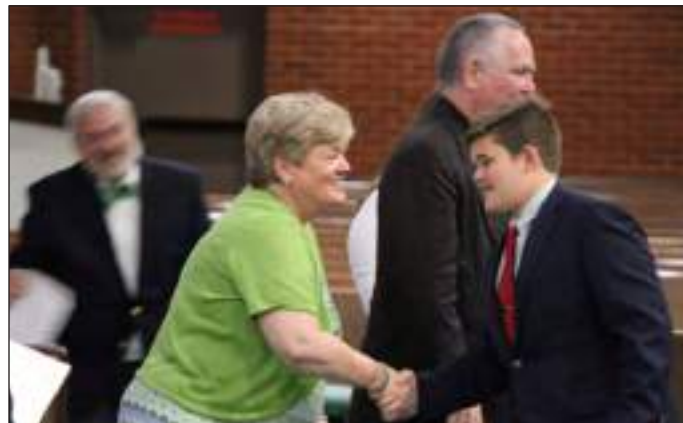

Social Action

BUILD: On May 10 BUILD held our Nehemiah Action at Heritage Hall where 1933 people from 26 congregations throughout Lexington came and stood together to ask our city officials to make changes to the way things are done in Lexington to better serve people who are directly or indirectly struggling with crime, mental health and drug usage.

We were so successful!

The mayor has put \$200,000 in the city budget for mental health court. Funding was ending, but now mental health court can continue to serve those people with mental illness who have committed minor, nonviolent crimes, giving them excellent care for their mental illness instead of time in jail. This has been very successful during the trial period and can now continue as secure funding has been committed!

On the drug issue, the Health Department has agreed to work with BUILD to expand the present needle exchange program, a successful entry point for people to decide to go into treatment, as well as offering screening for Hepatitis C and HIV, and get used needles off the streets.

And, after 3 years of our campaigning for best practices against violent crime, this year Mayor Gray agreed to contract with the National Network for Safe Communities to analyze crime in Lexington the last 5 years. This is the first step towards understanding the violent crime patterns and then addressing the best practices offered by the National Network for Safe Communities. Many cities after following this path have seen significant reductions in violent crime. This is what we want for Lexington! Our cry has been "Stop the Violence!" and we believe this is a great move in that direction.

We had 373 people from MQ that made these wins possible! Fantastic! Our goal was 350, so we did great and our presence spoke loudly to the community that the people of MQ care about these issues, and living out God's call to do justice and standing for the poor. I am so proud of this community!

The next steps are:

The Celebration on Monday, June 11 at the MQ gym. Dinner at 6:15, program starts at 7. This is for all Justice Ministry Network members (and anyone else who is interested in knowing more about BUILD). We will celebrate our victories, our turnout to the Action and the hard work of our justice ministry network members, and kick off the Investment Drive. Each justice ministry network member (JMN) is invited to invest \$200 (or more) and be an owner of this ministry. This is an invitation and not a requirement! Our congregation goal this year from our JMNs is \$14,500. Together we can grow this ministry and take on even bigger issues, making Lexington a city for God!

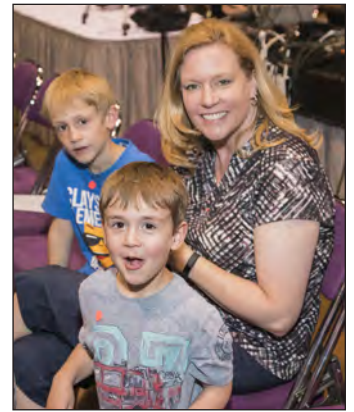

"Do you realize you just made a Father without a lap?" the angel clucked.

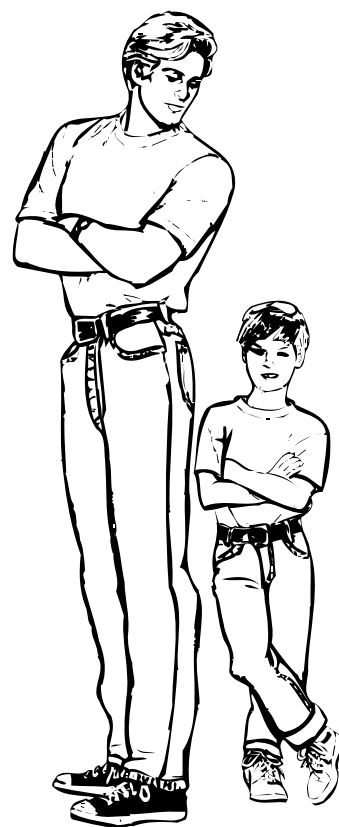
