We are currently organizing our eleventh annual “Friends of the Poor Walk” to benefit local, needy families. This project is part of a nationwide effort to increase awareness of the challenges faced by those living in poverty and raise funds that will directly benefit our local communities.

Because of the social distancing requirements currently in place, our event will be VIRTUAL this year. The official walk date is Saturday, October 3rd, but since we are virtual, we have the flexibility to walk anytime between Friday, October 2nd and Sunday, October 4th.
