They know how important your need for feedback is and will attend to it as soon as possible. Please encourage your child to move on to another subject. Some teachers are using the comments feature on Google Classroom for students to ask questions in real time and to converse with their peers. Please know that those are monitored until noon each day and should be for academic conversations only (See Parent/Student Handbook). If a student or you have a question after noon, an email to the teacher is best.

We know the hardship that this situation puts on many of our families. By the end of this week, the Diocese of Paterson Catholic Schools Office and St. Patrick School will provide resources to parents for counseling services for students in need.

In addition, the Diocese of Paterson Catholic Schools Office has asked us to distribute weekly surveys to parents and students. The survey will benefit us greatly, helping gauge how the school as well as the Diocese is managing the eLearning effort and how you and our students are managing the effort too. Timely feedback will be very beneficial and important to us. Thank you in advance for your feedback!

As a working parent myself, I know this is not an easy transition. We appreciate your patience and compromise as we work through the inevitable bumps in the road in our new normal. We can do this! We WILL do this! As the prayer I say each morning says, "let goodness, discipline and knowledge lead us to patience, peace and understanding" - especially during this season of Lent.
