


The story is in the statistics...



Trinity academic progress data:

Based on statistics of 2017 graduating seniors from Fort Smith high schools -

- Several Trinity alumni ranked in the **top five** in graduating public school senior classes.
- Trinity alumni make up **24% of the top 5%** of graduating public school senior classes.
- The **only** 2017 female National Merit scholar in Fort Smith is a Trinity alumnus.

Student 2017 Assessment Results:

Terra Nova 3 is utilized by 42% of the schools using achievement testing in the United States, which is a definitive majority of the testing demographic. Trinity students were tested in and scored:

- Reading: 78th percentile
- Language: 77th percentile
- Mathematics: 76th percentile
- Science: 72nd percentile
- Social Studies: 77th percentile

The average percentile score shown per subject means that the school's score is higher than that percent of the schools in the norm group for that subject for this specific year.

Student Diversity:

Trinity's student population for the 2017-18 academic year is 47% Caucasian, 34% Hispanic, 2% African-American, 10% Asian and 7% Other Races. 50/50 male and female. 90% Catholic, 10% non-Catholic.
