


#### What does it mean to be "obedient?"

In today's Gospel, we hear about how Jesus "was obedient to Mary and Joseph." To obey is to follow a request or command given by someone who has rightful authority over us. Sometimes we do not like to be obedient because it means we must do things as someone else tells us, not as we might want to do. We want freedom to do things our own way. The key here is understanding why it is important—and even necessary—for us to follow the orders of one who has a right to give us commands for our own benefit, and when it is proper to obey those commands.

Jesus, though he was the Son of God, was obedient to his parents and to God, his Father. In fact, it was his obedience even unto death that saved us. This week, let us together explore the happiness that is found when we practice loving obedience to God and to those who have legitimate and proper authority over us.



Step One

#### CONNECT with our daily LIVES

- What do we usually mean when we talk about "obedience" or to obey someone?

#### **CONNECT** with Scripture and Tradition

#### **Discussion Questions**

- 1. The boy Jesus remained in Jerusalem, but His parents didn't know this. Have you have any such surprises in your life? Describe one.
- 2. Obedience is a reflection of the loving trust of those who are in authority. Do you agree with this statement? How do you model and teach trust in God in your family? How do you help your children or other subordinate to grow in trust of each other and you?
- 3. God entrusted parents to each other and children to their parents. How is the Holy Family guiding you grow in unity with your spouse? What are some ways you practice listening and guiding your children to grow in obedience to God's call for their lives?

#### **Practical Activities**

For the Individual

#### Spend time before the Blessed Sacrament in the Church.

At Christ the Good Shepherd, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed to the faithful to see for adoration and prayer on the first Wednesday of each month from 6:00–8:00pm and on the First Friday of each month for the entire day. You may also visit any other day and spend time with the Lord in his presence in the tabernacle.

#### For Couples

#### Remember how your relationship got started.

Pull out your photos and recall how your shared story started. Talk about when and how you have found Jesus in your relationship. Civilly married couples are strongly encouraged to seek marriage in the Church--called a *convalidation*. This simple, yet beautiful rite of marriage constitutes one's marriage as a true sacramental union. It involves the willingness of both husband and wife to make a new decision to enter into a valid Catholic marriage and enables them to return to receiving holy Communion. #### For the Domestic Church

#### Play "Get to Know Yourself" Charades

Together with the whole family brainstorm various situations in your household and write each on a separate piece of paper. For fun add some funny, even impossible situations, like alien invasion. Fold and put in a container. Everyone takes turn pulling one paper and acting out with spoken words one family member in the given situation. All must guess who this person is. This will help you know how other family members see you and it will help you recognize areas of your life that need a change. Little ones will need a bit help. At the end of the game help everyone summarizes what they learn about themselves.

#### Missionary Mindset

#### Go on pilgrimage to a church you have never visited.

Like the Holy Family that traveled to Jerusalem every year for Passover, take your family to Mass to another parish. There are many wonderful and beautiful parishes in our archdiocese and in the state of Texas! Spend time enjoying grounds, sacred art, and people. Most of all find Jesus in the tabernacle. Every time the red lantern next to the tabernacle is lit, this is the sign that Lord is present and waiting for you.

#### What Makes us Catholic?

Both Easter and Christmas are followed by an octave: an eight-day period during which the feast is celebrated. The eighth day is also called the octave and days in between are said to be "within the octave." From Christmas Day until January 1st, the Solemnity of the Blessed Virgin Mary, Mother of God, is the Octave of Christmas. The Christmas octave liturgy gives us clues that every day within the octave is treated the same festivity as the original feast day of the Nativity of our Lord. The octave gives us time to impress upon our souls the mysteries, joys and graces of the principal feasts of the Church year.

#### Word of the Week - Obedience

Obedience (Lat. obêdire, "to hearken to", hence "to obey") is the complying with a command or precept. It is here regarded not as a transitory and isolated act but rather as a virtue or principle of righteous conduct. It is then said to be the moral habit by which one carries out the order of his superior with the precise intent of fulfilling the injunction. St. Thomas Aquinas considers the obligation of obedience as an obvious consequence of the subordination established in the world by natural and positive law.
