


# **An Ultimate Love Story**

Today's gospel is one of the most beloved stories of all time, commonly known as "The Prodigal Son." Jesus dramatically illustrates a torrid story of a son gone astray and a father's relentless pursuit. We are moved by the father's lavish treatment of a young man who had certainly done nothing to earn it or deserve it. No one would blame such a father if he were to say, "That worthless son of mine; how dare he do this to me!" Yet his concern is not for how he was wronged but what he could do to help make it right.

It has been said that "He who cannot forgive others, destroys the bridge over which he himself must cross." While it is in the nature of God the Father to forgive; for us, forgiving the deepest hurts requires considerable effort and quite literally a Power beyond our own. Perhaps this story has so captivated us because we ourselves long to be forgiven in this way. Jesus came to make things right, and he tells us that such radical forgiveness it is not only possible, but necessary for us to enter into eternal life. May this inspiring love story help us to write our own ultimate love story within our lives.

Opening Prayer

#### CONNECT with our GOD

## **CONNECT** with Scripture and Tradition

As a domestic church (your household) or Small Faith Group, pray and read through some of the following (you can select) Scriptures & Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) references as time permits.

#### In the HOLY SCRIPTURE we read:

- ""Repent and be baptized...in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins." Acts 2:38
- We should bear with one another through love. Ephesians 4:32
- When we pray for forgiveness, we must also be willing to forgive. Luke 17: and Matthew 6:9-12.

#### In the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC), we read:

- We should be generous and tireless in forgiving one another. CCC #2227
- The family is the school for learning to forgive and be forgiven. 1657, 2227
- Forgiveness must be given to whoever trespasses against us: 2840, 2845

#### Discussion Questions

#### Choose from among these according to the needs and interests of your group.

- 1. The story in today's gospel, known as "The Prodigal Son" has throughout the centuries been one of the most treasured and memorable stories in the bible. Why do you think that is true?
- 2. Jesus forgives us and asks us to forgive each other. What does that mean to you?
- 3. It can be very hard to forgive someone who has hurt you very much. Thinking of the teaching of Jesus, what could you do to become more forgiving when forgiveness is difficult?
- 4. In what ways could you practice compassion and forgiveness toward others each day?

- 1. Who in my life needs forgiveness from me? How could you begin to forgive that person?
- 2. Who in my life do I need to ask forgiveness from? How could I begin that conversation?
- 3. Am I ready to meet Jesus in the sacrament of reconciliation?

#### Forgive and be forgiven

This week, seek forgiveness for yourself or offer forgiveness to someone. Tell someone that you forgive him or her and why. Ask for forgiveness from someone. Admit your wrongdoing. It is nothing to be ashamed of to admit when you are wrong; instead, it is a shameful thing not to!

#### Assume good will

Find ways to be more forgiving and patient with one another this week. Assume good will from your spouse. If deeper problems are preventing that, seek help.

#### For the Domestic Church

## What are you grateful for? What are you sorry for?

Many families have taken up the admirable habit of going around the table to say what each person is grateful for. <u>Next time</u>, <u>add: "What are you sorry for?"</u> See how that changes your lives!

## Missionary Mindset

#### Be a Peacemaker

Individual forgiveness contributes to a more peaceful and just world because peace does not mean lack of disagreement, but patiently bearing with one another's weaknesses. Everyone you meet is going through something hard. Practice simple kindness and consideration to strangers. Let others go first. Resist the urge to judge. Have a generally patient and forgiving attitude toward others. Pray for those who mistreat you. Be a peacemaker. Watch this video with at least one other person. The end will surprise you.

Closing Prayer

- We sign ourselves with the Sign of Cross.
- According to what we reflected on, or whatever is in my heart share a petition, at the end we all say: *Lord hear our prayer.*
- Then we can pray the Our Father, Hail Mary and the Glory be...
- As we finish, let us share a sign of peace with each other.

for I know my transgressions; my sin is always before me.


Against you, you alone have I sinned; I have done what is evil in your eyes

# What Makes us Catholic?

We Don't Believe in "Cheap Grace"

The term "cheap grace" can be traced back to a book written by German theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer published in 1937 called *The Cost of Discipleship*. In his book, Bonhoeffer defined "cheap grace" as "the preaching of forgiveness without requiring repentance, baptism without church discipline; Communion without confession. Cheap grace is grace without discipleship, grace without the cross, grace without Jesus Christ." Notice what is emphasized in Bonhoeffer's definition of "cheap grace." It is on the benefits of Christianity without the costs involved; hence, the adjective "cheap" to describe it. Catholics share Bonhoeffer's belief that grace is free gift from God-freely given--though for it to be effective we must be willing to turn from sin and become followers Jesus.

## Word of the Week - Mercy

The word 'mercy' comes from the Latin misericordia, which comes from the two words miseria, meaning wretchedness, misery or affliction, and cor, meaning heart. Etymologically "mercy" means a heart for the misery or affliction of another; it means compassion or pity. "Mercy includes showing kindness to those who don't deserve it and forgiving those that deserve punishment." Mercy is one of the defining characteristics of God. Exodus 34:6 says: "The Lord, the Lord, a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love and faithfulness."
