
#### **Good Shepherd Sunday**

Happy Feast Day! We call ourselves the community of Christ the Good Shepherd. It is all the more important for us to know, then, what it means for us to follow the Good Shepherd.

In the first reading today, both Paul and Barnabas spoke out boldly (quoting Isaiah 49:6), and said: "I have made you a light to the Gentiles, that you may be an instrument of salvation to the ends of the earth." We ourselves, by our baptism, share in the mission of the Suffering Servant of the Lord of which the prophet Isaiah spoke. His mission is also ours: to bring all people to conversion, repentance, and healing. We hear in the gospel that Jesus desires to "...give them eternal life" so they "shall never perish." An important way we do that is to listen to the voice of the Shepherd as proclaimed in the Holy Scriptures at Sunday Mass. In today's gospel, Jesus tells his disciples: "My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me." May our deepest desire be to hear the voice of the Lord, to keep his commandments, to receive the sacraments of the Church in the company of this holy community, so that we may help one another in this life and one day have the eternal life Jesus promises those who follow him. ## Step One

#### **CONNECT** with our daily LIVES

In today's gospel, we hear Jesus himself speaking to us: Jesus tells us that he wants us to have eternal life and not perish. What do you think Jesus means when he says this?

Using this Guide can be as simple or as "in depth" as you want. If you do only the opening prayer section, that's great! To go deeper, follow the steps as shown. For children, see "Resources," page 8.

As a domestic church (your household) or Small Faith Group, pray and read through some of the following (you can select) Scriptures & Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) references as time permits.

#### In the HOLY SCRIPTURE we read:

- We do not live by bread alone but by every word that comes from the mouth of God--Matthew 4:4.
- Jesus promises the Holy Spirit to help us remember everything he told us--<u>John 14: 25 -26</u> & <u>John 16: 12 -13.</u>
- As a deer yearns for running streams, so my soul longs for you, my God-<u>-Psalm 42</u>

#### In the Catechism of the Catholic Church, we read:

- The Liturgy of the Word is an integral part of the celebration (of Mass)--CCC 1190
- Every human person seeks to know the truth and experience goodness--<u>United States Catholic Catechism for Adults, online version, page 32</u> (page 4 in the hard copy)

#### **Discussion Questions**

- 1. Why is listening important? Do you consider yourself a good listener? Why or why not? What could you do to become a better listener?
- 2. Prayer is a way of both talking to and listening to God. How do we hear the voice of Jesus, the Good Shepherd, at Mass? Do you often pay attention to the Sunday Mass readings when they are proclaimed? What are some ways you could do this better? (Hint: this CGS FAMILY Guide, page 3) provides us with links to explore the Sunday readings each week.)

Pope Benedict XVI emphasized that eternal life is not something that awaits us after death, but is a reality that begins in this world: "Eternal life' is life itself, real life, which can also be lived in the present age and is no longer challenged by physical death. This is the point: to seize 'life' here and now, real life that can no longer be destroyed by anything or anyone."

3. So many people in today's world are overcome with worry, addictions, bad habits and sins that keep them from enjoying "real life" as God intended—a life of faith, hope, and love. How can listening to God's Word at Mass help us to help people in their darkest moments?

#### Reflection Question

How has attending Mass and listening to Jesus helped you in your darkest moments? If you feel you have missed out on this, how might you open yourself to the possibility of what God has prepared for you at Mass?

Step Three

#### CONNECT with OTHERS...

#### Living the Gospel with commitment & action.

What can I do to be more devoted to God's Word at Mass so that it will give me the wisdom and strength to be a person who is free of worry, addictions, bad habits and sins? How can I, in turn, help others to be free of these things and live a life of faith, hope, and love. How can listening to God's Word at Mass help us to help me in my darkest moments?

#### **Practical Activities**

For the Individual

#### Pre-read the Sunday Readings.

Pre-read the readings for Sunday Mass. If anything, simply read the Gospel. Always available at <u>bible.usccb.org</u> Consider using one of the resources on page 3 of this Guide to understand them better and be ready to hear them well at Mass.

#### For Couples

#### Read the Gospel of the Sunday together.

This can be a very simple exercise. Read the gospel reading (or any of them). If you like, mention the names of people you would like to pray for, then either sit quietly for a moment, or conclude with the *Our Father*. Studies show that less than 1 in 1000 marriages end when couples attend Mass, practice their faith, and pray together regularly.

#### For the Domestic Church

#### Bible Improvisation!

Invite your children--young and older--to act out the gospel reading in your own home. Invite friends to participate! It can be elaborate or simple. Do an "improve" of the gospel on the spot! Improvisation is the activity of making or doing something not planned beforehand, using whatever can be found; it is is a very spontaneous performance without specific or scripted preparation. Laugh, cry, and talk about it together!

#### Missionary Mindset

#### Share the Word

Invite someone to read the Sunday gospel with you (follow the formula "for couples" above.)

Sometimes Catholics get so busy trying not to say too much about their faith, when many people are dying to hear the Good News, if only someone would share it with them. We, too, need to be moved by the faith of others.

Be bold about your faith! You will be surprised what happens!



Closing Prayer

- We sign ourselves with the Sign of Cross.
- According to what we reflected on, or whatever is in my heart share a petition, at the end we all say: *Lord hear our prayer.*
- Then we can pray the Our Father, Hail Mary and the Glory be...
- As we finish, let us share a sign of peace with each other.

Pope Francis Explains What Happens with Liturgy of the Word at Mass

The Liturgy of the Word is important because there God speaks to us, and the same Holy Spirit who inspired the sacred Scriptures opens our minds and hearts to that living word. At the table of God's Word, we find nourishment for our lives as we listen to the Old and the New Testaments proclaim the one mystery of Christ and call for our response. Drawing from the richness of the Church's Lectionary, the Liturgy of the Word invites us to silent openness to God's saving message as it resounds in the ecclesial assembly and continues God's constant dialogue with his people, the Church.

Word of the Week - Eternal Life (okay, so two words...)

When the Bible speaks of eternal life, it refers to a gift of God that comes only "through Jesus Christ our Lord" (Romans 6:23). Believing in Jesus brings us eternal life. Faith must be nurtured—we need one another to help our faith grow and stay strong during difficult times. One reason we go to Mass is so that we can hear God's voice and all of us together can hear God speaking to all of us. 
