
This Week

Happy Birthday, Dear Church!

In the gospel according to St. Matthew, Peter proclaims that Jesus is "...the Messiah (Christ), the Son of the living God" (Mt. 16:16)--the one whom God sent to save the world. In response, our Lord commissions him: "...so I say to you, you are Peter, and upon this rock I will build my church, and the gates of the netherworld shall not prevail against it (Matthew 16:18). This did not come to pass until after Jesus' death and resurrection, when the work of redemption was accomplished and it was time for the work of the Church to commence. Today, we remember how we, the Church, got our start. We were formed by God to be "the assembly of the people of God...an interim arrangement which mediates salvation in the time between the earthly ministry of Jesus and the future coming of his kingdom."* With the promised coming of the Holy Spirit, the disciples are given power to bring the good news of salvation to the world, beginning in our own households. Why do we, as baptized Christians, think we are so incapable of doing this? Today, in the gospel for Mass during the day, Jesus promises, "The Advocate, the Holy Spirit whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything and remind you of all that I told you." Perhaps it is our doubt, our reluctance to believe, that keeps us from teaching our children all that Jesus told us. May God the Holy Spirit renew in us the power to do what Jesus promises we CAN do, if we believe.

Opening Prayer

- Listen to the Lord speaking to you as someone reads out loud the Gospel for this Sunday (see previous page for links to Scripture readings for this week).
- Listen to each other as everyone shares what in the Gospel caught their attention.
- Pray the <u>"Glory be..."</u>

Step One

CONNECT with our daily LIVES

Have you ever received a gift or something that you longed for and which you had insistently waited for? How did you feel when you finally received it?

Using this Guide can be as simple or as "in depth" as you want. If you do only the opening prayer section, that's great! To go deeper, follow the steps as shown. For children, see "Resources," page 8.

Step Two

CONNECT with Scripture and Tradition

As a domestic church (your household) or Small Faith Group, pray and read through some of the following (you can select) Scriptures & Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) references as time permits.

In the HOLY SCRIPTURE we read:

- The love of God has been poured into our hearts Romans 5:5
- The Spirit helps us in our weakness Romans 8:26
- Born of water and Spirit John 3: 5-8

In the Catechism of the Catholic Church, we read:

- Who is the Holy Spirit? CCC #152, 683-686
- The Pentecost: Christ's Passover Fulfilled and the Holy Trinity fully revealed. CCC # 731-732
- The Church in the Spirit: Priestly, prophetic, royal People of God. CCC #781-786.

Discussion Questions

- Specifically in this week's readings, what activities are associated with receiving the Holy Spirit? How are these activities fulfilled within the Church, the body of Christ, and within individual Christians?
- In the Psalm prayed, "Lord, send out of your Spirit, and renew the face of the earth." How do you envision God renewing the face of the earth?

- How do you respond to the words, "The Spirit himself bears witness with our spirit that we are children of God, and if children, then heirs."
- Pope Francis has said, "We need the Holy Spirit to transmit faith. We can not do it alone." What unique gifts have you received to help others know and love Jesus?

Plan an afternoon or evening when everyone in the home can share one of their gifts/talents. Maybe one person leads everyone in a game of soccer, another plans a craft activity, someone else reads a story, or another cooks a special dessert. See how God's gifts to everyone shine and we show His love through those gifts.

Closing Prayer

- We sign ourselves with the Sign of Cross.
- According to what we reflected on, or whatever is in my heart share a petition, at the end we all say: *Lord hear our prayer.*
- Then we can pray the Our Father, Hail Mary and the Glory be...
- As we finish, let us share a sign of peace with each other.

What Makes us Catholic?

THE BIRTHDAY OF THE CHURCH

The Catechism of the Catholic Church says: "The origin and growth of the Church are symbolized by the blood and water which flowed from the open side of the crucified Jesus." For it was from the side of Christ as he slept the sleep of death upon the cross that there came forth the "wondrous sacrament of the whole Church." As Eve was formed from the sleeping Adam's side, so the Church was born from the pierced heart of Christ hanging dead on the cross" (#766). Some have called Pentecost the "birthday of the Church," but that is more of a pious custom and is not an official teaching or declaration. This image is used since, in a way, the Church comes forth from her initial formation in the "womb" of Galilee during Christ's public ministry. She comes forth now to begin her mission to the ends of the earth.

Word of the Week - PARACLETE

Grk. parakletos, occurs 5 times in the New Testament, all in the writings of John. The translation of the word in English Versions of the Bible is "Comforter" in the Gospel, and "Advocate" in the Epistle. The word for "Paraclete" is passive in form, and etymologically signifies "called to one's side." General Meaning: In general the word signifies: (1) a legal advocate, or counsel for defense, (2) an intercessor, and (3) a helper.
