This Week

"What is Truth?" (and who reveals it...)

We recall from the story of Christ's passion that the Roman procurator, Pontius Pilate, scoffed at Jesus during his trial and said, "What is truth?" (John 18:38). In today's world, many believe that truth is whatever they want it to be ("my truth"); they deny that truth is a reality outside of ourselves that we cannot invent, we can only accept or reject. Truth is something we seek, not something we create. How do we find truth? In the Gospel for this Sunday, we learn from Jesus that it is the Holy Spirit who guides us: "When he comes, the Spirit of truth, he will guide you to all truth." Thus, it is through the Holy Spirit that we come to know truth. Knowledge of the truth, in turn, points us back to back to understanding Christ (and the Holy Trinity): God the Son is always in relationship to with his Father, and God the Father with his Son. The sharing of their love for one another is God the Holy Spirit. Jesus desires that we share in that lifegiving, truth mediating love, which is why he says, "...[the Holy Spirit] will take from what is mine and declare it to you." God promises that all who sincerely seek the truth will find it. We must be willing to be led and guided by the Holy Spirit. It is through the Spirit that we are able to truly know who we are, our relationship to God, and what we are to do with our lives because God has revealed himself to us. May our lives be an adventure of seeking God who is himself Goodness, Truth, and Beauty.

Step One

CONNECT with our daily LIVES

CONNECT with Scripture and Tradition

As a domestic church (your household) or Small Faith Group, pray and read through some of the following (you can select) Scriptures & Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) references as time permits.

In the HOLY SCRIPTURE we read:

- True worshipers will worship the Father in Spirit and truth John 4:23-24
- The Spirit comes to the aid of our weakness. Romans 8: 26-27
- No one can say 'Jesus is Lord', except by the Holy Spirit. 1 Corinthians 12:3

In the Catechism of the Catholic Church, we read:

- Spirit makes known the Word of the Father. <u>CCC #687</u>
- The Holy Spirit opens our minds to understand Christ's death and Resurrection <u>CCC #737</u>
- The Holy Spirit will lead us all into all truth <u>CCC #729</u>

Discussion Questions

- 1. Do we see each person of God (God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Spirit) at work in the world today? If so, how?
- 2.1 John 3:18 says, "Children, let us love not in word or speech but in deed and truth." What can we do to live the truth in a world that says that truth is we say not as God says?
- 3. What do we do when our "version" of the truth contradicts that of a spouse or loved one? What about co-workers and neighbors? In what ways can we seek to be faithful to the truth in these situations?

- In your own prayer life, to which person of the Trinity do you most often turn? Why?


What Makes us Catholic?

The Nicene Creed

The Nicene Creed, which we say at every Sunday Mass, is a summary of what Catholics believe. More properly called the Niceno-Constantinopolitan Creed, after its origin in the first two Councils of the Church in 325 and 381. We recite the Creed so often we can often lose appreciation for what incredible words we are saying! Christians are the only people on planet earth that profess to believe that there is only one

only people on planet earth that profess to believe that there is only one God, and that God is Father, Son, and Holy Spirit—a truly extraordinary claim, made possible only because God himself revealed himself and his nature to us. This gift of knowledge was given by Jesus, the Son of God.

Sometimes the <u>Athanasian Creed</u>—a longer and more detailed creed—is professed on Trinity Sunday. Try praying these creeds very deliberately and consider what your Christian faith means to you.



HOW HAVE YOU SEEN GOD PRESENT AND ACTIVE IN YOUR LIFE THIS WEEK?

Word of the Week - Creed

A "creed" is a formal and public statement of beliefs. Christians especially refer to the <u>Apostles' Creed</u> or the <u>Nicene Creed</u>. These Creeds express our unity of belief as we commit ourselves to the truth revealed to us in Christ and made known to us by the Holy Spirit.
