I want to remind you about and invite you all to our "town hall" style meeting in the Church this Tuesday, February 28th, from 6:30-8:30pm to learn more about and discuss the recently-published document from the Archdiocese, *A Catholic Response to Gender Identity Theory: Catechesis and Pastoral Guidelines* (there's a link on our homepage, and you can also read it here: archdpdx.org/gender). It's carefully and thoughtfully written, and even if there are those unpersuaded by its arguments, hopefully one can at least come away with a better understanding of why the Church teaches what it does. None of us want our children to be victims of discrimination or rejection; all of us want to honor their dignity and help them along the road to a mature self-acceptance and a healthy sexuality. We encourage you to set aside some time to read it (it's only 13 pages), especially before Tuesday evening if you plan on joining us.

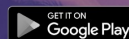
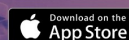

It offers opportunities for your family to engage daily with the spiritual pillars of Lent: prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH: THOUGHTS ON FAITH

How many Lents has it been? After all, for most of you, it's not your first rodeo. The challenge for us as Catholics is to find a way to do it *differently* so that it isn't a case of *been there and done that!* Not that this would necessarily be bad, but a fresh start is good for the soul! That's what Lent is: it's *God calling His wayward children back to Him*.

There is a reason that *Ash Wednesday* is a busier Mass than Christmas. We know that we are sinners, and we feel it in our very being, the need to start fresh. We don't have to figure this out for ourselves; the Church gives us the tools that come from Jesus Himself. The tools are *to Pray, to Fast, and to Give alms*. Our job now is finding something in each, *at least one in each category, to get us started*.

Think outside of the box. Find something to get yourself started. You know what you usually do or don't do. Amp it up! And if you need help, there are a

lot of organizations, ministries, and the like who are happy to give you their ideas of how to keep a good and holy Lent.

Hold on to this as your *rule of thumb: this is NOT your spiritual project*. Anything you choose to do needs to bring you closer to Jesus by your *praying more*, by your *giving more*, and by your *giving up things that are getting in your way*. Think about it. Remember, the only wrong way for Lent is *not doing Lent at all*. You can do this! All who were marked with ashes on Ash Wednesday are in this with us! (See, I am with you in this too!)

May God grant us a fruitful and holy Lent! Amen +

The First Sunday of Lent: Seeds

REFLECT: Today's Gospel tells us that Jesus was led into the desert to be tempted. We know how Jesus endured and rejected these temptations and what they symbolized. But why the desert? What does it symbolize? The desert looks barren but there is life – seeds awaiting water to grow and blossom.

In my life there are barren places, deserts. These deserts are waiting for me to open to the waters of God's amazing love to grow and blossom. Like Jesus, I must be open to the grace of God, my creator, guide, friend. There are seeds in me that need tending in order to grow. There are seeds that need to be unburied or find a new direction or need to die.

ASK: Can I accept God's help in recognizing the seeds in me? How can I unbury and tend these seeds?

PRAY: Father, open my heart as I begin this season of Lent, to look for seeds that need to be watered, tended, and healed. Lead me to the resources that will allow this growth and healing.
