FAREWELL FROM CHI-NHAN



Dear Holy Parish family:

It's hard to believe that my assignment here is up already. Things are so busy there's been no time

at all for me to watch the clock. Not that I've had any need to; thanks to everyone's warm welcome, I've quite enjoyed my time here!

How have I spent that time? One thing I've noted is how many Anointings of the Sick I've been privileged to witness. Next to the celebration of Holy Mass, it's the sacrament I've seen administered at Holy Trinity most frequently.

Usually we think of the effect of Holy Anointing as healing and strengthening; I was only ever told as much when I was in religious education. That's always true, of course. I always see great consolation and renewed hope in those who are anointed. But the list of its effects in the Catechism doesn't stop there at all.

Anointing of the Sick also gives to the sick person a special "union with the passion of Christ" for "the sanctification of the Church for the good of all" (CCC 1521-1522). As he hangs on the cross for the sake of the world, Jesus meets the sick person precisely in their illness: and if he has joined their cross to his own, then he has joined them to his resurrection for the salvation of the world. In other words, through

Trinity Holy Anointing, the suffering person does not only receive Jesus's love, but also receives the grace to love with Jesus in a way that gives even more grace to

That's a powerful thought. At times, it is even a difficult one. Not all of us are sick in a literal sense, and lively here that but we all have weaknesses in our lives that we wish Jesus would immediately take away. It took a long time for St. Paul himself to accept it when Jesus said to him, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Corinthians 12:9). But in the end, St. Paul realized that accepting his cross meant that he did not have to be perfect himself in order to love others with the perfect love of Jesus. He realized that his weakness showed he was a human, and yet through his "union with the passion of Christ," he could love like God.

> That's what I take with me from this summer with you all. We talk so much in the seminary about all the problems in the world and the Church that one of the most destructive traps for us is thinking we have to be perfect so to fix it all ourselves. The humble opening of sick hands and wounded hearts to the merciful love of Jesus is what our world needs. It's what I needed to be reminded of! And I thank you all for it.

> Until we meet again! Someday soon, God in his mercy may grant the honor to this imperfect one of anointing your hands, too.

WEDNESDAY BIBLE STUDY

Join fellow Holy Trinity parishioners at Wednesday Bible Study to collectively grasp an understanding of God through His Word! *Acts: The Spread of the Kingdom* tells the compelling story of the first Christians, tracing how their witness of the gospel spread outward from Jerusalem and revealing how the seeds of Church structure and authority took root.

Presented by Jeff Cavins and Sarah Christmyer, this study helps us to see our place within the Church as a disciple of Christ, connecting the struggles and joys of the first disciples striving to live the life of Christ to our own struggles and joys today.

This is a **20-session study** that will begin on **Wednesday**, **September 13**th and run through early April. There will be breaks for separate Advent and Holy Week studies as well. We'll meet **weekly** from **9:00-11:00am** in the **Fireside Room**.

The study guide includes online access to the videos that will be watched together. Participants can purchase it directly from Ascension Press (about \$46 with shipping) or you can buy it through Holy Trinity for \$40 (discount due to bulk shipping rate). Financial assistance is available, so do not let the cost prevent you from participating!

Do you have unfinished business? We all need something; that's part of the reason we come to Mass each week. Even if we can't name what it is, being here gives us something we need. Most important, we were *called* to be here. We think it's our idea, but God had it first! He called, we heard, and now we're here at Holy Trinity in Beaverton! The Legion of Mary was founded in Dublin, Ireland on the 7th of September in 1921. It is a lay Catholic organization whose are giving service to the Church on a voluntary basis in almost every country.

Legion of Mary's Aim

The object of the Legion of Mary is the Glory of God through the holiness of its members developed by prayer and active co-operation in Mary's and the Church's work.

Legion of Mary's Unit

The unit of the Legion of Mary is called a praesidium, which holds a weekly meeting, where prayer is intermingled with reports and discussion. Persons who wish to join the Legion must apply for membership in a praesidium.

Legion of Mary's Active Works

The Legion sees as its priority the spiritual and social welfare of everyone. The members participate in the life of the parish through visitation of families, the sick, both in their homes and in hospitals and through collaboration in every apostolate and missionary undertaking sponsored by the parish. The works are more of Spiritual Works of Mercy.

Legion of Mary's Active Membership

This membership is open to all faithfully practicing Catholics. Members attend weekly meetings (about an hour). They engage in prayers and active work. Candidates under 18 years of age can be received in Junior praesidia.
