BRETT'S TWO-CENTS

Hello, everyone! I have several updates for you this week, in no particular order:

1. As Fr. Bill mentioned, we have several parishioners that have been impacted by the Maui wildfires, not to mention the thousands of local residents themselves. We've been thinking about how best to support the victims of this awful tragedy; after much consultation, we've decided on two things. First, we'll be making a donation from the Parish to the Hawai'i Community Foundation's Maui Strong Fund. Second, we've posted the following link on our website and social media sites so that you can donate to the same fund if you would like: bit.ly/HCF-Maui.

After careful research, we chose HCF's Maui Strong Fund because of the solid infrastructure they have in place to swiftly direct funds to the community organizations who are at the heart of emergency response efforts. Catholic Charities and the American Red Cross are also on the ground if you prefer to give through them. Please join us in praying for the individuals and families 3. impacted by these devastating wildfires.

2. As fall and the beginning of a new school/ program year approaches, we're anticipating a couple of changes (actually, reversions) to our weekend Masses. First, we'll be reinstituting our in-pew collection, starting the weekend of September 9-10. I've heard many of you talking about how much your household budgets have been stretched over these past months. The same is happening here at the Parish and School, and we're hoping a return to passing the baskets will help remind folks to support our parish Enjoy these last couple weeks of summer. Fall (and community. If you prefer to give online instead, football!) are just around the corner! Yay!

either Erica or myself would be delighted to assist you with getting that set up. Just call the office, or go directly to h-t.org/donate to setup a recurring donation.

Second, also on the weekend of September 9-10, we'll be discontinuing our outside Communion station at the 9:30am Mass. Over the past few months, we've seen the number of folks using that station steadily dwindle as more and more of our parking lot crowd have returned to Mass inside the church. Please know that we will continue to live stream the 9:30am Mass, so if your health prevents you from coming inside, you can still watch from home or the parking lot. And there's always a Communion station near the baptismal font for that Mass which you could come inside to receive from. On the other hand, if you've been thinking about returning inside and have just stayed outside due to habit, consider this an opportunity to make the move. We'd love to see you again!

Finally, every weekend I get asked at least three or four times if my health is okay. It is indeed (well, as far as I know)! I have lost a lot of weight since the beginning of Lent, but that is due to less food and more exercise. The less food is by far the harder discipline! Vigorous exercise (as in heart and breathing rate up) almost every day, eating until I'm about 75% full and then stopping, and a 30-minute walk after dinner seem to be the key for me. I'm grateful for all of your concern. My biggest conundrum is having to acquire a new wardrobe; I hate clothes shopping!

WEDNESDAY BIBLE STUDY

Join fellow Holy Trinity parishioners at Wednesday Bible Study to collectively grasp an understanding of God through His Word! *Acts: The Spread of the Kingdom* tells the compelling story of the first Christians, tracing how their witness of the gospel spread outward from Jerusalem and revealing how the seeds of Church structure and authority took root.

Presented by Jeff Cavins and Sarah Christmyer, this study helps us to see our place within the Church as a disciple of Christ, connecting the struggles and joys of the first disciples striving to live the life of Christ to our own struggles and joys today.

This is a **20-session study** that will begin on **Wednesday, September 13**th and run through early April. There will be breaks for separate Advent and Holy Week studies as well. We'll meet **weekly** from **9:00-11:00am** in the **Fireside Room**.

The study guide includes online access to the videos that will be watched together. Participants can purchase it directly from Ascension Press (about \$46 with shipping) or you can buy it through Holy Trinity for \$40 (discount due to bulk shipping rate). If you want to purchase it through the Parish, please sign-up by Monday, August 21st so we can place the order in time. Financial assistance is available, so do not let the cost prevent you from participating!

FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH: THOUGHTS ON FAITH

The Assumption is one of the beautiful mysteries of our faith. First, we have to begin by remembering who Mary is. Mary was greeted by an angel of God, Gabriel, who told Mary that she would bear the son of God. We remember God's name for Mary, "hail, full of grace", and most importantly, that Mary agreed to do what God asked of her. Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord, be it done unto me according to thy word." From that moment on, Mary's life became inexorably attached to her son, Jesus.

Consider what Catholics believe about Mary. We have *four core beliefs* that specifically define who Mary is: she is the *Mother of God*; her *immaculate conception* (without Original Sin); her *perpetual virginity*; and (what last week's Holy Day celebrated) her *Assumption*, body and soul, into heaven. In these four beliefs, Mary is set apart from the rest of humanity, and every part of her life and death is impacted by this.

The early Church and Saints spent a lot of time meditating on scripture and Mary's life through the life of Jesus. Mary's "yes" made everything else that Jesus would experience, even His suffering, inescapable for Mary. Mary shared it all through the end of Jesus's earthy life and ascension into heaven. The Church teaches that God "assumed Mary, body and soul" into heaven. St. Juvenal, bishop of Jerusalem at the time of Mary's death, attested that he and the apostles were present for Mary's death but that her tomb was empty, concluding that her body was taken up to heaven. We take by faith that Mary "shares all eternity with Him who raised her from the grave and drew her up to Him in a way that only He can understand" (from an ancient author).
