FOR WHAT IT'S WORTH: THOUGHTS ON FAITH

God gave us the gift of *free will*. It might have been easier if God just saved us for *our own good*. Parents out there know what I mean, wanting to make the correct decision for our children, but that doesn't work either. Because of the dictates of original sin, we want what we want when we want it, even when it's been pointed out that some things are just wrong for us. God created paradise and gave all freedom to enjoy all the good that He created, and what did Adam and Eve choose? Thanks to the serpent, the devil, they chose the one thing that was forbidden to them, ruining everything.

Then Jesus came on the scene to rescue us. Although Christ could have saved the world by His miracles, He chose to save the world by His suffering. Jesus gave us that perfect sacrifice on the cross, offered once and for all. As scripture and Jesus tells us, "If any man would come after me, let him deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow me" (Lk 9:23).

Every choice we make either follows Jesus or it doesn't. We are either on God's side, or we have made a bad choice. We have a tool kit to help us: our *Baptism* finished with our *Confirmation*, and then *Mass* and *Eucharist*, and *Confession* when we sin. These tools nourish us and strengthen us so we can make the right choices and live as followers of Jesus. Ephesians 6:10 confirms that with these things we can "(finally) draw our strength from the Lord and His mighty power." It continues:

"Put on the armor of God so that you may be able to stand firm against the tactics of the devil. For our struggle is not with flesh and blood but with the principalities, with the powers, with the world rulers of this present darkness, with the evil spirits in the heavens. Therefore, put on the armor of God, that you may be able to resist on the evil day and, having done everything, to hold your ground. So stand fast with your loins girded in truth, clothed with righteousness as a breastplate, and your feet shod in readiness for the gospel of peace" (Eph 6:11-15).
