GREETINGS FROM FR. BILL

This weekend (Saturday, 9/30), we held the first of three seminars in our series on end-of-life issues and planning. I hope it was helpful for all who attended! These topics are very important. Our second seminar is on Saturday, November 18th, where our Health Ministry coordinators will discuss advanced directives, POLST, and others important documents. If you missed this past event and want to know more about any topics specific to dying, death, and funeral planning, please don't hesitate to contact our office. I, Fr. Anthony, Dcn. Brett, or our funeral coordinators can assist you in answering questions and reflect on pre-planning.

I again want to draw your attention to a very important opportunity that is coming our way in a few months, November 30th - December 2nd. The Archdiocese will be hosting Dr. Bob Schuchts (founder) and Sr. Mirian James Heidland, SOLT, and team from the John Paul II Healing Center for their "Healing the Whole Person" weekend conference. The goal is to "promote and inspire transformation in the heart of the Church, by healing and equipping God's people for the New Evangelization."

I have personally benefitted from the John Paul II Healing Center's work on several occasions when they came to minister to us priests here in the Archdiocese. This group represents the best of Catholic outreach to help us all heal from the wounds that bind us. It will be offered at Our Lady of Lavang's new parish campus in Happy Valley (very near Clackamas Town Center). Several of our staff will be in attendance, so hopefully we will see you there. Additional details and how to register are on Page 4 of this bulletin. Come and be set free!

Please pray for the priests serving our Archdiocese who will be gathering in Newport for our annual "Priest Convocation" this week, including myself and Fr. Anthony! It is a time of continuing education as well as rest and fellowship.

Important note regarding our weekday Masses: All five of our morning daily Masses will take place as usual with the help of Fr. Bruce Cwiekowski. However, our School Mass on Wednesday afternoon will not take place – instead, there will be a liturgy of the word and adoration service.

This coming **Saturday, October 7th at 10:00am** is our annual Blessing of the Animals! Ideally, this would happen on the Feast of St. Francis (October 4th), but Saturday mornings tend to be more convenient for folks. If you have a pet you would like blessed, come join us in front of the church for a simple rite of prayer and blessing. Please make sure your pet is secured (either a leash or crate) to ensure your furry friend's safety!

The blessing itself involves the sprinkling of holy water. No, this will not make your disobedient dog become obedient! But, it is a sacramental that reminds us of the blessing God pours upon us through our pets. If you have an animal that is uncomfortable with such gatherings, you can always bless them on your own. If you still want to take part on Saturday, just keep them secured in your car during the event and make sure to let us know so we can approach your vehicle when we impart the blessing.

Last year's event was definitely a dog-fest, but we had several cats and even a hedgehog join us! I look forward to seeing you and your pets on Saturday.



BINKY PATROL BINK-A-THON

A *binky* is a new, homemade blanket that can be sewn, knitted, crocheted, fleece tied, or quilted and ranges in size from a 3x3 square to a twin-size bed covering. Binky Patrol was founded in 1996 by parishioner Susan Finch as a way to bring comfort to children in a local battered-women's shelter. It has since blossomed into a nationwide effort of over 160 chapters and 20,000 volunteers to comfort children and teens who are homeless, in foster care, battling chronic and terminal illnesses, or recovering from traumatic events including domestic violence, abuse, and other violent crimes.

Thanks to a grant from the MrBallen Foundation, Binky Patrol is hosting a multi-state **Bink-A-Thon** – a one-day blanket-making event – on **Saturday, October 28th**, with one of them happening here at Holy Trinity! Fleece, fabric, and batting for making fleece-tied blankets will be provided, along with coffee, pastries, and fruit. Just bring a pair of sharp scissors and a warm heart! All ages are welcome (there must be **at least one adult per four minors**) and this does count for community service hours.
