Peter Pan Audition Info/Instructions

Who Needs to Audition?

Large roles – any student interested in a large role must audition.

Medium roles – any student who has had a medium role in any St. Ann School Drama Club production does NOT have to audition. He or she is welcome to audition, but it is not required. Students who have not been in a St. Ann School Drama Club production or have only had a small role must audition.

Small roles – only students who have never been in a St. Ann School production need to audition.

My child does not need to audition, what do I do?

Complete a permission form (see attached) and either send it to the Drama Club via the school office or drop it off during auditions.

How do we sign up for auditions?

Any student who is required to audition or would like to audition (even if not required), must sign up for an audition time. See Signup Genius.

What does my child need to do to audition?

Large Role - Girl

Use the Large Role – Girl audition script
Learn all three sections of dialogue
Sing the song Second Star from the Right. The lyrics are included on the audition script.

Large Role - Boy

Use the Large Role – Boy audition script Learn all three sections of dialogue Sing the song *Never Smile at a Crocodile*

Tinkerbell

Tinkerbell is a larger role. For girls who are not interested in playing Peter Pan, Captain Hook or Wendy, but are interested in Tinkerbell, they should use the Tinkerbell script
Sing the song Second Star from the Right

Medium Role – Boy or Girl

Use the Medium Role script Learn the Curly part Sing the song *Following the Leader*

Small Role - Boy or Girl

Use the Small Role script Learn the Cookie part Sing the song *Following the Leader*

How can we practice the song?

The songs and the sheet music are attached to this email and are available in the Dropbox. The students only need to practice the portion of the songs included in the audition script.

Review of the Process...

- 1. **Determine whether or not your child needs to audition.** Students who have *never* been in an SAS Drama Club Production must audition. Students interested in a large role must audition. Students who want a small role and have been in an SAS Drama production do not have to audition. Students who want a medium role and have had at least a medium role in an SAS Drama production do not have to audition.
- 2. **If your child does not need to audition**, send a completed permission form to the Drama Club by October 20th
- 3. If your child needs to audition, sign up for one audition slot
- 4. Find the appropriate audition script and music, as described above.
- 5. Bring your child to the audition 10 minutes before your scheduled time. We may run behind, so plan on an extra 15 minutes, just in case. Bring the permission slip, payment and Parent Volunteer form with you if you have not already sent it in.

CHIEF TIGER BAMBOO: (in normal voice) Yeah, and sometimes it feels a little ridiculous to talk like that. (snaps back to the game with pompous voice) But there is one important thing: where have you hidden Tiger Lily?

FOX: What? We ain't got the Princess!

CHIEF TIGER BAMBOO: (normal voice) Yes you do! Tell me. Or else!

SKUNK: Honest, we don't!

CHIEF TIGER BAMBOO: (pompous voice) Then that is a big "People-from-Across-the-Ocean" lie! If Tiger Lily is not back by sunset, Lost Children get burned at the stake!

JOHN: Mom, tell us a story about Peter Pan!

WENDY: What did you say? You don't think I'm actually your mom? Micheal?

MICHAEL: Moms tell stories. You tell us stories. You must be our mother.

WENDY: But I've just been playing! You have a real mom at home. Michael, John, you remember?

MICHAEL: Did she have silky ears and wear a fur coat?

WENDY: That was Nana! I think it's time we go home.

PETER: No go home! Stay many moons. Have big fun time.

WENDY: Now, Peter – we've got to be practical, and indian braves don't even talk like that. (to MICHAEL and JOHN) Do you just want to stay here and grow up like savages?

Part 4: Sing The Second Star from the Right

The second star to the right, wish you could show the way, Where Peter's stories never end, no fathers to obey. The second star to the right shines with a light that's rare. And if it's Never Land you need, the light will lead you there.

Medium Role

Part 1 - Read Curly

SLIGHTLY: Curly, did you see the pirates?

CURLY: No, but I saw a wonderfuller thing. High over the lagoon I saw the loveliest great white bird. It's flying this way. (search the sky)

TOOTLES: What kind of bird, do you think?

CURLY: I don't know, but it looks so weary, and as it flies it moans "Poor Wendy."

SANDY: See, it comes, the Wendy!

CURLY: That's Tinkerbell. Tink is trying to hurt the Wendy. (cups hands over mouth) Hullo, Tink!

TINKERBELL: Shoot the Wendy bird! Quick! Peter wants you to shoot the Wendy bird!

CURLY: Stand back, I'll get it. (shoots with bow and arrow) I've shot the Wendy! Peter will be so pleased.

TINKERBELL: You silly donkey. (laugh)

CURLY: This is no bird, I think it must be a lady.

SLIGHTLY: And Curly has hurt her.

CURLY: Now I see. Peter was bringing her to us.

SANDY: To take care of us?

CURLY: I did it. Friends, goodbye. Peter will banish me for sure. (takes a step to leave, but PETER enters from stage left)

SMEE: I'm sure they're here - I kin smell 'em!

COOKIE: Yuck, and they don't exactly smell good, neither.

TINKERBELL

Girls who wish to audition as Tinkerbell may choose to use this script rather than the large role script.

Part 1: Read Tinkerbell

TINKERBELL: Hi everyone! I'm Tinkerbell. Before we get started...(steps forward to look at the audience) can you understand what I'm saying? (pause for response) Good. 'Cause most humans just hear bells when I talk. This is the story of Peter Pan and a girl named Wendy who believed in him. It begins in the Darling family nursery.

CUBBY: Hey, Tinkerbell! What's that you say?

TINKERBELL: I have a message from Peter Pan.

SKUNK: What is it?

TINKERBELL: (mimes shooting an arrow) Shoot!

HOP: She says he wants us to shoot something!

TINKERBELL: Yes! A great big Wendy bird!

PETER: Tink, what are you doing? Oh, Tink, I'm so sorry I banished you.

TINKERBELL: You should be!

PETER: You see, everyone's left and there is nothing to do but take my medicine.

TINKERBELL: No! No! No!

PETER: Wendy left it for me. (TINKERBELL grabs medicine and swallows it)

TINKERBELL: Captain Hook left it for you. It's poison. (falls down)

PETER: Everyone, do you believe in fairies? If you do, clap your hands!

TINKERBELL: (recovers, curtsies to the audience) Thank you.
