



Advent Confessions

Advent is a season of devout and expectant delight in preparation for the celebration of Christmas and the return of Jesus at the end of time. In the spirit of devotion and expectation, the season carries with it a penitential character of conversion and seeking the forgiveness of one's sins. The scripture readings of Advent attest to this, especially as Jesus evokes the Flood of Noah's time (repentance and conversion before it is too late), St. Paul speaks of walking in the light of Christ rather than the darkness of sin (ongoing conversion and repentance after baptism), and St. John the Baptist calls for repentance because the Kingdom of God is at hand. Going to confession during this season is an essential way of preparing for the celebration of Christmas and part of our vigilance for the Lord's return at the end of time. To promote and support your participation in the spirituality of Advent, a confession schedule is found below.


Respect Life and Social Justice Concerns




Christmas Postcard Invitation
