



Lent: Moving Toward the

Cross—"Repent, and believe in the Gospel," will be the words you hear when ashes are placed on your forehead this Wednesday. It is a simple, yet poignant way of

beginning the observance of the Lenten Season. Jesus inaugurated his public mission with the same exhortation, "repent," meaning change your mind and live your life another way according to the Good News, the gospel, that Jesus preached. In terms of the Christian life, the practice of the faith, there is always something about which to change your mind. Sin creeps into our lives and we act on our wounded hearts. Everything about our lives are not well ordered toward God and we can easily follow the glitter of the world and fall prey to the ephemeral ideas and false wisdom and practices of the culture. There is much that detracts and distracts one from the faith. That's why we have Lent, a beautiful. reflective season of repentance and renewal that leads our lives to change. We become transparent before the Gospel to be called away from that which is unconverted in our lives, sin, bad habits, an anemic faith, malformed minds, and a weakness of the will to choose the good. Part of the change of mind is a change of the normal routine of life to include practices of penances and selfdenial. They aren't fun, but help us to open our minds to God. Immerse yourself in the season and ask the Lord where you need to have a change of mind, a conversion of your heart. May God bless and renew you this Lent!

Ash Wednesday

Ash Wednesday is March 1st. For planning purposes, the following is the liturgical schedule for the day:

- Mass with the Distribution of Ashes: 7:00 am, Noon, 5:00 pm
- Distribution of Ashes Outside of Mass: 7:00 pm

There are regulations that accompany and support our spiritual practices during Lent. The Church being the body of Christ is a community of persons. The community acts as one in many ways including the things we observe and do:

- Days we abstain from consuming meat: Ash Wednesday and the Fridays of Lent
- Days we fast: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday.

Abstinence -- Catholics over 14 years of age are bound to the obligation of abstinence. Abstinence is to be observed on Ash Wednesday and on all Fridays of Lent. On days of abstinence, meat may not be eaten at all. Eggs, milk products and condiments made from meat may be eaten. Fish and all cold blooded animals may be eaten (eg., frogs, clams, etc.).

Fast -- Catholics over 18 and up to the beginning of their 60th year are bound to the obligation of fasting.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are the days of fasting. On these days, only one full meal is allowed. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength, may be taken according to each one's needs, but together they should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids, including milk and fruit juices are allowed. Food necessary for the taking of medications is certainly allowed. Regarding other weekdays of Lent, participation in daily Mass and the voluntary observance of fasting is recommended. Abstinence from meat on other Fridays of the year is recommended but not required.

Additionally, prayer, penance and almsgiving for the sake of world peace is recommended for all Fridays of the year. Commendable, particularly during Lent, is generosity to local, national and world programs of sharing our abundance, the traditional Lenten Devotions and all the self-denial summed up in the Christian concept of "mortification."

Formation for All

Formation for All is an online program designed to help Catholics to learn and pray about Respect Life and Social Justice issues. The current session addresses the topic of Adult and Embryonic Stem Cells. In addition to discussing the difference between embryonic and adult stem cells, it also addresses the need to approach science and medicine with a moral understanding of the intrinsic dignity of the Human Person. Applications Now Available for the St. Francis Xavier Scholarship

Thanks to a generous financial donation, the Xavier Foundation is able to offer the St. Francis Xavier Scholarship. This scholarship awards FULL tuition to Xavier High School for up to four years to qualifying

students. Students in grades 8-11 may apply. In order to be eligible for consideration of the St. Francis Xavier Scholarship, students must meet the following criteria:

- They are a practicing Christian, participating in an area parish or church.
- The combined household income must be less than \$75,000 per year.
- They must have 2 teachers or 1 teacher and 1 coach's letter of recommendation to apply for the scholarship.
- They must have 3.0 or better GPA or grade equivalent (if they have completed Grade 9 or above).
- They must be in good standing within their community (i.e. no community offenses on record).

Once the scholarship is awarded, the student must maintain a 3.0 GPA and have no major disciplinary issues.
