

Pilgrimage to Israel—Thank you for your prayers during our pilgrimage to Fr. Israel. I know many of you followed us on Facebook as well. Your prayers David were very evident from the first day, O'Connor especially as we struggled to leave

Cedar Rapids due to the inclement weather. Of all the pilgrimages I have led, this was the most unique and profound. The holy sites we saw and the people we met were graced moments. The group essentially lived the mysteries of our Lord's life where he lived, taught, healed, died and rose from the dead. Our journey included places that were part of our Blessed Mother's life as well, all essential to the story of our salvation.

A critical part of our pilgrimage is that we learned of the plight and condition of the Christians in the Holy Land, which is very serious because they are in a political and religious pinchers which threatens to squeeze them out of the land of our Savior. Christianity has had a presence in the Holy Land virtually since Jesus died, rose and ascended into heaven. Now, their numbers are dwindling because they find living there extremely difficult and they are leaving, a serious trend we hope and pray that will be reversed. It is important for us that we support our brothers and sisters there, and do what we can to advocate their lives in the Holy Land.

As time goes by, I am sure that the Holy Land pilgrims will have many opportunities to share and act upon the graces they have received. Once a pilgrimage is made, one's faith and life is affected and changed. May the graces we received become a part of your life as well.

A Message from Archbishop Jackels Promoting the February 11-12 Annual Appeal for Catholic **Charities--** "One of our mission priorities is to teach stewardship as a way of life and a course of action. As a way of life, stewardship teaches that we do not own anything; all is on loan from God, entrusted to us to manage. And as a course of action, stewardship teaches us to manage according to God's good pleasure, that is, to provide what is needed to live in dignity to the poor, our dependents, and ourselves. St. Joe's: I hope everyone is doing well! Flu season has hit the seminary and one by one the seminarians are getting sick. Thankfully I got my flu shot but it also means I've been making a lot of store runs for Gatorade and medicine! But it's also given me the opportunity to bring communion to the sick, and not to be insensitive, but good practice for mu next step in seminaru! (Continued next column.)

February 10th will be the first day of my pastoral internship which will last until the end of July, and in May I will begin working at a hospital as a chaplain. I'll be in the Good Shepherd Cluster of New Hampton, North Washington, and Ionia all semester and summer long, and in the summer also at Covenant Hospital in Waterloo. I'm officially over halfway through seminary and the internship and chaplaincy are good moments to practice what I've learned so far, experience more closely the life of a parish priest, and confirm my own call to the priesthood. As much as I can I hope to get involved in all different kinds of ministries, lead prayer and worship, and teach and preach. Although I am certain God is calling me to become a priest, this will be a great time of discernment, not just work on my weaknesses, but also explore what my strengths will be, what do I have to offer in ministry? Please pray for me as I begin the "final stretch" of seminary, preparing for ordination to the deaconate summer of 2018 and priesthood summer of 2019. It still feels a far way off but I know after this summer everything will start speeding up! Please also pray for Jim, Tom, Michael, and Josh, my brother seminarians in my class who are also going on internship (Tom will be at St Matthew's in Cedar Rapids so you may see him!), and that more men will listen for God's call. God is calling men to serve His Church as priests, men and women to pray and work in religious life, and holy marriages and dedicated single people, but we have to help each other grow and pray and listen for that call and direction. 


