

Moving Toward the Cross—is the thematic emphasis about Lent we are observing here to help sharpen our focus on this penitential season. Inspired by the prophecy of Joel, I shared on Ash Wednesday that Lent calls us home to the Father

because we have strayed from him through sin. By our own commission or omission, sin is a personal choice that wounds the heart and toxifies the soul. The remedy for sin is the forgiveness of God and reconciliation with him ministered to us through the mercy of the cross. Our homecoming involves a movement to the cross to participate in it and to embrace the merciful fruits that flow from it. Look deeply into your lives and recognize you are wounded because you have sinned. Turn around from the sin, repent, change your mind and the direction of your life and come home to the Father. Lent leads you to forgiveness, freedom from sin and to the new life of Easter.

Holy Family Sculpture—While in Bethlehem, I came across a beautiful statuesque olive wood sculpture of the Holy Family which accentuated St. Joseph's role as being the protector of Jesus and the Blessed Virgin Mary. It is a modern rendition of the Holy Family yet with beautifully carved classical details depicting the intimacy and care of family life. Since it was so beautiful and would complement the décor of the church, I purchased it to be placed permanently in the church as a center of devotion to our patron, St. Joseph and to the Holy Family. I hope you will see the graceful aesthetic of the sculpture as I do. I purchased the sculpture from a Christian co-op in Bethlehem. The Christians are a beleaguered minority in that city and in the region, and are struggling to stay because of political, social and religious issues that militate against them. Doing business with them is a concrete, positive way of supporting our distressed brothers and sisters. As a part of the sculpture purchase, I was given about four hundred simple olive wood rosaries which we will sell here as a way to fund the sculpture and to economically and prayerfully assist our Christian friends in Bethlehem. The rosaries would be great gifts for birthdays, anniversaries, first communions, confirmation, etc., or to have as a constant reminder to pray for persecuted and politically alienated Christians in the Holy Land and throughout the world. There will be more to come



### St. Joseph Offers Small Class Sizes

A unique aspect of St. Joseph Catholic School is the class size. The average size of our kindergarten through eighth grade classes is sixteen students. With small class sizes, teachers have more one-on-one time with students. Smaller class size allows students to be more comfortable participating in class discussions and it creates a sense of community among their peers. Parents feel comfortable contacting teachers knowing their children are receiving individual attention. Teachers are better able to identify signs of learning difficulties as well as strengths the students possess, helping them provide students the best learning experiences to maximize academic success. These are just a few of the many benefits of having a small class size.

**St. Francis Xavier Scholarship:** Thanks to a generous financial donation, the Xavier Foundation is able to offer the St. Francis Xavier Scholarship. This scholarship awards full tuition to Xavier High School for up to four years to qualifying students. Students in grades 8-11 may apply. Eligibility criteria are:

- Student is a practicing Christian, participating in an area parish or church.
- The combined household income must be less than \$75,000 per year.
- Student must have 2 teachers or 1 teacher and 1 coach's letter of recommendation to apply for the scholarship.
- They must have 3.0 or better GPA or grade equivalent (if they have completed Grade 9 or above).
- They must be in good standing within their community (i.e. no community offenses on record).

Once the scholarship is awarded, the student must maintain a 3.0 GPA and have no major disciplinary issues. ### Wine & Wisdom




