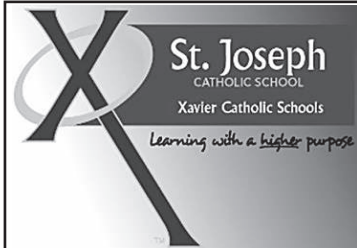

Fr. Mark Kwenin was born in Cape Coast, Ghana, March 21st, 1967, to Catherine Hayford and the late Isaac Brandford Kwenin. Fr. Mark graduated from high school in 1985, college in 1991, and entered the seminary in 1992. Ordained a priest on September 29, 2000, Fr. Mark served as associate pastor at Mary Immaculate Conception Parish in Cape Coast from 2000 to 2003 as pastor at Mary Assumption Parish from 2003 to 2008, and Mary Queen of Peace Parish from 2008 to 2012. Fr. Mark also assumed the duties of assistant financial administrator for the Archdiocese of Cape Coast in 2007. In 2013, Fr. Mark left parish work to serve his Archdiocese as Substantive Financial Administrator, holding that post until his recent departure to join our St. Joseph parish family. Other positions held by Fr. Mark during his years in Cape Coast include: Executive Member of the National Union of Ghana Catholic Diocesan Priests Associations, Assistant Vocations Director, Secretary of the Archdiocesan Administrative Board, Secretary and Member of the Archdiocesan Investment Board, Finance Officer for Catholic Mission Press, Acting General Manager for Catholic Mission Press and Care Taker of the Archbishop's House.

What Kind of Soil Are You?—This Sunday's gospel relates a familiar parable about the Sower and the Seed. Because it is so familiar, one can tend to tune it out because the story and lesson is already known. Even so, we shouldn't forget that God's word is infinite, received by his finite creation (us). Hence, there's always something ever ancient; something we know and understand, and ever new;

something we hadn't understood before, when hearing God's word. I think that that is one point the parable makes. You and I, as disciples of Jesus, are the types of soil in which the word of God is generously planted. Be that rich soil, not the rocky, sandy or weed infested types. His word is powerful; full of grace. Our reception of his word can be from the perspective that there is something new and old to receive. Savor the old; what you know, and reflect upon it deeply. In the old, something new may be revealed. It may not happen every time, but there is always a contemporary application of the eternal word to your life situation. God's word is being sown in your lives. Receive it with an open heart.
