



**O'Connor** Anniversaries offer an opportunity to look back and to anticipate the future. Reflecting on the past, we give thanks for the marvelous ways God has worked in the school through the inspiration

of the Holy Spirit. It has been an environment of faith for the students seeking an understanding of God, themselves, life and the world through the richness of the Catholic Tradition. Let us praise God for the work he has done. Looking to the future, we can see our school as continuing the work God has entrusted to it by being that oasis of faith, beacon of hope and an excellent academic institution to educate our children. May we always depend upon God for what we do and offer in our parish, and may he richly bless the future of our school.

Catechetical Sunday—is celebrated this weekend. We focus upon our role as disciples, learners and followers of Jesus. We always have something to learn about our faith and to integrate into our lives. In a special way, we recognize and thank those who teach the faith, the catechists among us. Parents are the chief and primary teachers of their children in the ways of faith. Let that never go unsaid, unnoticed or unrecognized. The home becomes the school of faith which is taught by word, example and the Catholic culture that is established in the home. We also acknowledge and thank those who formally teach the faith as catechists in the Catholic schools, religious education programs, adult faith formation and the RCIA process. You support, supplement and reinforce the faith that is taught at home or nourish the adults who live the faith and pass it on to others. Thank you for using your beautiful charism to promote the faith and support its development in our parish.

**The DACA Program**—Archbishop Jackels has communicated with the Archdiocese via The Witness, and with priests, regarding the President's recent action to terminate the DACA program. I share with you excerpts of what he said followed by an action item.

"The President has terminated the DACA program, which addressed the situation of people without legal status who were brought to this country as minors.

As a result, Dreamers, as the people affected are called, fear deportation, have to put plans for the future on hold, and maybe even feel betrayed by the only country they know.

Why should Catholics be concerned about this? A number of reasons come to mind:

- 1. The God-given dignity of every person made in the image of God, regarded as children of God is not given due respect in the way Dreamers are being treated.
- 2. It ignores the principles for a just society articulated by Catholic social teaching, such as the right to life and to the things needed to live in dignity, including protection from harm all the way from the womb to the tomb, and devotion to the common good.
- **3.** It represents a one-sided approach to human rights and duties. For example, Catholic social teaching recognizes the right of a nation to secure its borders, but also its duty to have a reasonable policy to receive immigrants, as well as the right of people to emigrate.
- 4. It doesn't reflect what Jesus taught through his response to the Pharisees, that the rule of law has to consider the real-life circumstances of people, or it results in treatment that is inhumane, without compassion, lacking in mercy.

Laws are important. Laws represent the behavior expected of responsible citizens in a just society. But laws can be bad, broken, or unfairly applied. When they are, like our present immigration laws, they need to be corrected accordingly.

What can we do? Pray to God for the poor people affected by the termination of the DACA program, for all immigrants, and for lawmakers, that with wisdom and courage they can agree on a legislative solution in a timely manner.

We can also write our legislators, urging them to find a way to fix a broken law. And in that regard, the organization known as "Justice For Immigrants" has set up an easy "click and send" letter on their website: https://justiceforimmigrants.org/action-alerts/action-alert-support-dream-act-2017/."
