**THEME:** Responsibility for one another

Introduction

There used to be a public service announcement on television we have all heard."Friends don't let friends drive drunk". It means we have a responsibility for our friends. This goes against the grain of people not wanting to get involved in the lives of others. But friends have a responsibility for their friends.

And we Christians have a responsibility to others. That is the theme of today's readings. Our readings today list three different kinds of responsibilities we have to others. The responsibility to speak, to respect and to heal.

First we have a responsibility to speak. The prophet Ezekiel in today's first reading speaks of the role of the watchman to warn of danger. We have a moral duty to speak the truth about right and wrong whether to society or to individuals. There

are different ways of doing it but as
Christians can we be silent when there are
attacks on innocent life, when our society is
going in the wrong moral direction when
people we know are damaging themselves?
The Lord says to us, through Ezekiel today
that we have a duty to speak. To say nothing
is to become morally complicit in the wrong
another does, like watching another damage
anothers car. If we speak, and that person
refuses to listen, we have done our duty. We
have the responsibility to speak the truth to
another.

And there is the duty to respect another. St Paul lists in his letter to the Romans the duties of love: do not kill, do not commit adultery, do not steal, do not covet. We can state them in a positive way. We have the responsibility to respect another's life, respect another's marriage, respect anothers property and respect another's integrity.

Finally the Gospel reading goes a little bit deeper into our responsibility in dealing with conflict. We can call it the Lord's teaching about conflict resolution or conflict

management. Here is the case: What do you do if someone does something wrong to you? How is the Christian to handle it.

## **CONCLUSION**

The point of today's readings is that Christian love is not a feeling or an emotion but a responsibility. The greatest harm we can do people when they face spiritual danger is to do nothing and just look the other way. AMEN.
